INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

The Fund's objective is to achieve, over the long term, preservation of capital and a satisfactory return through focused investing in long security positions. The Fund seeks to provide capital growth by primarily investing in a portfolio of equities, American Depository Receipts, and which may also invest in exchange traded funds (ETFs).

The Fund is considered an "alternative mutual fund" according to National Instrument 81-102, meaning it is permitted to use strategies generally prohibited by conventional mutual funds, such as the ability to invest up to 20% of its net asset value in securities of a single issuer (rather than 10% for conventional mutual funds); the ability to invest up to 100% or more of its net asset value in physical commodities either directly or through the use of specified derivatives; borrow, up to 50% of its net asset value, cash to use for investment purposes; sell, up to 50% of its net asset value, securities short (the combined level of cash borrowing and short selling is limited to 50% in aggregate); and aggregate exposure up to 300% of its net asset value.

RISK

Investors should be able to accept a medium level of risk and plan to hold for the medium to long term.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net asset value as at March 31, 2021 was \$2.3 million. Asset mix as at March 31, 2021 was communication services, 34.2%; cash and other net assets (liabilities), 33.6%; energy, 16.9%; financials, 8.8%; and industrials, 6.5%. By geography, assets were invested in securities of issuers based in cash and other net assets (liabilities), 33.6%, Canada, 32.7%; United Kingdom, 14.2%; United States, 11.7%; and Japan, 7.8%. The Fund's inception was April 17, 2020. In accordance with investment industry regulations, the Fund may not report performance until one year after its inception.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

As at March 31, 2021, the Fund's common equity investments comprised 67.3% of its net asset value. The Fund is permitted to have

an equity weight as high as 150% of its net assets (facilitated by the use of margin borrowings). As at March 31, 2021 the Fund was not fully utilizing its margin borrowing capability as we did not find common equity valuations to be sufficiently attractive to do so. The Fund will aim to be prudent in the prices that it pays for businesses consistent with its investment objective to achieve, over the long term, preservation of capital and a satisfactory return through focused investing in long security positions. We are prepared to increase the common equity weight significantly, with the increment to be funded firstly by reducing the Fund's cash holding and secondly by the potential use of margin borrowings. A higher common equity weighting, if implemented, would be expected to enhance future Fund performance.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Manager is responsible for the day-to-day operation of and for providing investment management services to the Fund. The Manager receives a fee for providing these services. This is calculated daily based on the net asset value of the Fund and paid monthly. During the sixmonth period ended March 31, 2021, the Manager received \$6,765 in management fees from the Fund, net of applicable taxes.

The Manager is entitled to receive a performance fee, calculated and accrued on each business day and paid monthly. During the sixmonth period ended March 31, 2021, the Manager received \$29,573 in performance fees from the Fund, net of applicable taxes.

Any administrative services paid for or provided by the Manager are charged to the Fund and are grouped and presented by expense type in the statements of comprehensive income. Depending on their nature, some expenditures are allocated to the Fund based on a variety of methods including net asset value or actual costs incurred. During the six-month period ended March 31, 2021, the Manager was reimbursed \$3,048 for operating expenses incurred on behalf of the Fund, including amounts paid to affiliates, net of applicable taxes. The Manager absorbed \$36,835 of operating expenses during the sixmonth period ended March 31, 2021, net of applicable taxes. Affiliates of the Manager provide administrative services associated with the day-to-day operations of the Fund. These affiliates of the Manager were reimbursed \$450 during the six-month period ended March 31, 2021 by the Fund for such services.

The Manager and/or its affiliates and key management personnel of the Manager and their family (collectively referred to as Related Parties) may invest in units of the Fund from time to time in the normal course of business. Transactions to purchase or redeem units are made at net asset value per unit. Standing instructions from the independent review committee were not required or obtained for such transactions. As at March 31, 2021, Related Parties owned 15,102 shares of the Fund.

The Board of Directors of the Manager is responsible for reviewing and approving the financial statements and overseeing management's performance of its financial reporting responsibilities.


Past Performance


Year-By-Year Returns

Management Fees

The Manager is responsible for the day-to-day management and administration of the Fund. The Manager monitors and evaluates the performance of the Fund, pays for the investment management services of the portfolio adviser and arranges for the administrative services required to be provided to the Fund. As compensation for its service, the Manager is entitled to receive a fee, payable monthly, calculated based on the average daily net asset value of the Fund.

Explanatory Notes

- 1. a) The information for March 31, 2021 is derived from the Fund's unaudited interim financial statements. For the remaining periods, the information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards.
 - b) The inception date of Series A and Series F units of the Fund was April 17, 2020.
- Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted daily average number of units outstanding over the financial period.
- Distributions are paid out in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both.
- 4. This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending net assets per unit.
- 5. The management expense ratio (MER) is based on total expenses (excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs but including management fee distributions paid to certain unitholders in the form of additional units) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The Manager may absorb certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses absorbed is determined annually at the discretion of the Manager.

The Fund may hold investments in ETFs and the MER is calculated taking into consideration the expenses of the Fund allocated to the series including expenses indirectly attributable to its investment in ETFs divided by the average daily net asset value of the series of the Fund during the period.

- The trading expense ratio (TER) represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value of the Fund during the period.
 - The TER is calculated taking into consideration the costs attributable to its investment in ETFs.
- 7. The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to a fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.
